The reason is that these two items are critically important to the well being and future of the club.

We are all aware that the club was founded over 80 years ago by a group of sailors interested in promoting sailing and social activities of the lake community. Well, this last Sunday I had the pleasant experience of dropping in on the club's waterfront while the clubs "all sail day" was in progress. Reflecting on the activity I observed, I would have to say that those objectives that the club was founded on were in good hands. Reid and Austin Francis (Members of the third and fourth generation of Francis sailors on Diamond Lake) were there as always supporting a rather large gathering of all different types of sailing boats operated by young and old sailors alike. Everyone was enjoying the sailing activity on a beautiful sailing day. They had over 15 sailboats on the lake with more coming in. Of course, these activities do not happen by accident and I want to thank the whole Francis family for their volunteer efforts to encourage sailing the Diamond Lake. By being a member of the Diamond Lake Yacht club, you share in these traditions and should feel good about the activities of your club.

As an update on the youth activities this summer, I will start with the swimming activities. As you are aware, we contract our swimming out to the Niles "Y" as they are the experts in this area. They ran two weeks of lessons and were full both weeks. The club initiated a new "Kiddie Kamp" activity spearheaded by Sharon Block that saw 30 participants over a two-week period. Youth sailing is still going on with over 40 young sailors participating in learning to sail or improving their skill level. A special thanks to Anne Coles and Julie Conboy Hesse who have spent countless hours working on youth sailing and coordinating with the "Y" on the swimming classes.

Your Board has received their first formal draft of proposed changes to the By-laws in their July meeting. The changes will be discussed and voted on in the August meeting to prepare for their hearing and vote at the annual meeting. In other actions the Board agreed to purchase five (5) used boats to support the youth sailing activity. In addition, it accepted a new policy for the use of the club's sailboats by the membership. This policy says that any member may use these boats at no costs provided it is cleared by the Rear Commodore and a release for it is signed. This provides another great benefit for belonging to the DLYC.

Ending this message to the membership, I want to thank all of the members who have volunteered their time to making the DLYC the place it is. Whether it is hosting a social event or sitting on one of the committees, your efforts are recognized and appreciated.
