THE DIAMOND LAKE YOUTH SAILING FUND

The Diamond Lake Yacht Club Board of Governors at their meeting of September 21, 2019 approved the creation of a Foundation created to support youth sailing at Diamond Lake. This Foundation called the **Diamond Lake Youth Sailing Fund (DLYSF)** is a fund located at the Michigan Gateway Foundation and allows our fund to have 501c3 (contributions are tax deductible) status.

I sincerely believe that the creation of this Foundation will be the most important thing that the DLYC will have done to promote sailing on Diamond Lake for some time. As a yacht club if we want to have a sailing program it has to start with our youth. While not all our children and grandchildren may wish to sail, we proved last summer that there is a significant group that do. Our sailing efforts will help create the memories that they will carry for the rest of their lives of summers spent at the lake. Remember, we have over 80 years of sailing tradition at the DLYC and as stewards of this tradition we need to make sure it continues into the future.

The idea for the creation of this foundation came from studying the member clubs in the Western Michigan Youth Sailing Association where most of the members have sailing foundations. These foundations start slowly but over time they become a major contributor for the purchase of sailing boats and equipment for the summer youth programs. It is a necessity in a good youth sailing program to upgrade the fleet on a regular basis to provide good and safe equipment. For instance, our program needs several more 420's for our intermediate youth sailors and an additional Opti for our beginners.

Contributions made to the Diamond Lake Youth Sailing Fund are made directly via check to the

Gateway Foundation at 111
Days Avenue, Buchanan Michigan 49107. On the memo line of the check indicate that it is for the Diamond Lake Youth Sailing Foundation and your contribution will be placed in the correct account. It's as simple as that.

Diamond Lake Youth Sailing Foundation (DLYSF)

Be a Donor

The Diamond Lake Youth Sailing Foundation (DLYSF) supports the youth sailing activities on Diamond Lake (one of the top sailing lakes in Michigan) and is open to all the residents of Cass County. The main emphasis will be teaching youth sailors the fundamentals and joy of this lifelong activity.

The DLYSF is a 501 (c) (3) organization headed by a five (5) member Board and was created under the umbrella of the Michigan Gateway community foundation of Buchanan Michigan.

Tuition for sailing classes covers the cost of the instructors only. Funds donated to the DLYSF will be used for the purchase of sailboats used for instruction of youth sailors. The boats used (Opti's, Sunfish, Butterfly's and 420's) have previously either been donated or purchased through the generosity of others. New Boats must be purchased to keep current and to support the growing interest in youth sailing in Southwest Michigan.

Donation checks are made out to the Michigan Gateway Community Foundation located at 111 Days Avenue, Buchanan, Michigan 49107. Please note on the memo line on the face of the check that it is for the Diamond Lake Youth Sailing Foundation and it will be credited to the appropriate fund.

Current donations will support the purchase of boats used by our youth sailors both beginners and intermediate skill levels. A 420-sailboat used in club, high school and college fleets is needed. They are normally crewed by intermediate skilled young sailors and require two (2) sailors per boat. In addition, an Opti-sailboat is needed for our beginners due to the increased interest in our program.

From the drop down, click on Renew Membership.) At the end of the renewal process, you will have the option of paying by secure credit-card transaction, or printing an invoice and mailing a check.

First Place—Mike Jarrick

Bear Tailgate Chili – Mike Jarrick

3 slices bacon 1 can diced tomatoes 1 lb ground beef Chopped green pepper

1 can kidney beans (undrained) Chopped onion
1 can chili beans (undrained) 3 T chili powder
1 tomato paste 1 T Cajun spice

Cook bacon. Remove. Brown ground beef in bacon grease.

Never pour off the grease.

Add remaining ingredients including crumbled bacon and simmer for a couple of hours.

Beer Bread — Sue Heinrich

3 cups self-rising flour 12 oz beer 3 T sugar melted butter

Preheat oven to 375° Mix the flour and sugar together. Pour in the beer and mix, the batter will be sticky. Place in a buttered, 9x5 in bread pan. Bake for 55 to 60 minutes until the top browns. Remove from the oven and brush the top with melted butter. Serve warm.

SURE FIRE CHILI RECIPE - JOHN SEIDL

*Sautee two large diced onions in a frying pan with olive oil

*Add ground chuck to pan with onions and brown, adding salt, pepper, and dusting of chili powder and Natures Seasons.

2 lb. ground chuck

1 lb. ground pork

*In large soup pot, add ingredients below and simmer on low heat.

2/28 oz. cans tomato sauce

1/28 oz. can diced tomatoes

2/15.5 oz. cans chili beans in sauce

1/15.5 oz. can Great Northern beans

1/15.5 oz. can kidney beans

*Strain grease from meat/onion mix and add contents to soup pot.

*Add seasonings to soup pot.

2 TBL. Sugar

2 tsp. cumin

2 TBL. garlic powder

3 TBL. chili powder

*Add 2 cups of water and simmer contents for 2-3 hours. Add additional seasonings to desired taste/heat.
